INTERNATIONAL STUDENT ADMISSIONS CHECKLIST FOR SOUTHEAST

<u>IMPORTANT</u>: It is your responsibility to complete and submit ALL documentation to our Admissions Office by the indicated semester deadlines in order for Minnesota State College Southeast to admit you to the college and issue you the Immigration Form I-20. *Please note some programs at Southeast have additional requirements for admission.

Complete application and submission of ALL required documentation is needed before application review.

Application deadlines:

- Applicants applying/entering from another country: **May 1** for Fall Term; **September 1** for Spring Term.
- Applicants currently studying in the U.S.: June 1 for Fall Term; November 1 for Spring Term.

Required Documentation:

1.	Must submit an International Student Application for Admission. Complete all sections being sure you indicate your major/program choice and providing your signature.
2.	Must have original TOEFL scores sent to our Admissions Office. For TOEFL testing locations, visit the TOEFL website www.ets.org/toefl. The TOEFL school code for Minnesota State College Southeast is 3695. To be accepted at Minnesota State College Southeast, applicants must obtain the following TOEFL scores: 500 or greater on the paper test; 173 or greater on the computer-based test; or 61 or greater on the Internet-based test.
3.	Must submit a completed Minnesota State College Southeast International Student Financial Statement. You must include with this signed statement a current original bank record showing sufficient funds available to cover your first year of educational and personal expenses.
4.	Must submit official transcripts. High school/college transcripts must be official and translated in English.
5.	Must provide records of immunization history and be current on immunizations. The Minnesota Department of Health requires college students to show up-to-date immunizations for tetanus/diphtheria (Td) and measles/mumps/rubella (MMR).

<u>Course Placement Testing:</u> International students may be required to take the ACCUPLACER Test upon arrival in the U.S. This test must be taken prior to course registration as the test scores will be used to place students in appropriate levels of courses. Scheduling a time to take the ACCUPLACER can be done by registering at the following link: www.southeatmn.edu/accuplacer.

<u>Tuition and Other Costs:</u> International students will be charged Minnesota resident tuition rates. **International students must maintain full-time student status (12 credits or more) each semester and be enrolled for on campus courses.** Students should have additional funds available to meet unexpected costs, such as the need to return home to their country for family emergencies.

<u>Health insurance</u>: Students are required to purchase an international student health insurance policy through the Minnesota State system unless they provide proof of other adequate coverage. If you have a health insurance policy on your own, you MUST submit a copy of the coverage to the Admissions Office. Health insurance is billed to your student tuition account and will need to be paid immediately.

Housing: Securing housing is the responsibility of the student. You may find additional information at www.southeastmn.edu.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION AT SOUTHEAST

The college is asking you to provide information including private and/or confidential information under state/federal law. The college is asking for this information in order to process your application. You are not legally required to provide the information the college is requesting; however, the college may not be able to process your application if you do not provide sufficient information. With some exceptions, unless you consent to further release of private information, access to this information will be limited to school officials, including faculty who have legitimate educational interests in the information. Under certain circumstances, federal/state laws authorize release of private information without your consent:

- to other schools in which you seek or intend to enroll, or are enrolled, if you are first notified of the release;
- to federal, state or local officials for purposes of program compliance, audit or evaluation;
- as appropriate in connection with your application for, or receipt of financial aid;
- to your parents, if your parents claim you as a dependent student for tax purposes;
- if the information is sought with a subpoena, court order, or otherwise permitted by other state or federal law;
- and to an organization engaged in educational research or an accrediting agency.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT AGREEMENT

Please Read Carefully

Contact the Southeast Admissions Office if you have any questions regarding this form. This form must be submitted along with your admission application.

If admitted to Southeast, I certify I understand and accept the following conditions and agree to abide by them:

- I understand I am required to pay ALL tuition and fees by the designated payment deadline date each semester. If I do not pay by the deadline date, I understand I will be prohibited from registering for future semesters. If I do not register for courses for future semesters, I understand I will have violated my immigration status and will be considered out of status.
- 2. I will have available sufficient funds for tuition, fees, other educational supplies, living expenses and health insurance for each semester I study at Minnesota State College Southeast. I recognize the cost of living is high, and financial aid from the college is not available. International students are not permitted to work off campus and on-campus work is not available for international students at Minnesota State College Southeast.
- 3. I agree to purchase the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities System International Student Health Insurance Plan as a condition of admission and continued enrollment. This must be immediately paid to Southeast, as it will be billed to my student tuition account. Exemptions may be granted only to students having government-provided national health insurance that exceeds the MnSCU plan. Students must maintain this insurance coverage throughout their attendance at Minnesota State College Southeast. It is the student's responsibility to ensure insurance is renewed every year of attendance. Minnesota State College Southeast assumes no responsibility for medical expenses.
- 4. I agree to arrive at Southeast on or before the date indicated on my Form I-20. I will participate in any new student orientation session as required by the College. I will report to Southeast's Admission Office to check in upon my arrival.
- 5. If necessary, I will take the Accuplacer Basic Skills test before I may be allowed to register for courses for my first semester and will fulfill the requirements that result from my scores on this test. Based on the test scores, I may be required to take additional English or math courses.
- 6. I will maintain my status with respect to United States Citizenship and Immigration Service regulations for the duration of my studies at Southeast. This includes but is not limited to enrolling as a full-time student (12 or more credits) taking courses on campus each semester and maintain a valid passport and I-20 at all times. If I have questions or experience problems related to my enrollment, I will immediately contact my Southeast international student advisor.
- 7. I authorize Minnesota State College Southeast to release to appropriate U.S. Government offices information required to determine my compliance with U.S. immigration regulations as allowed by federal/state data privacy laws. I understand Southeast must report to the U.S. Department of Homeland Security those students who have failed to register, failed to pursue a full-time course of study or failed to meet the minimum academic standards of the College. I understand Southeast must comply with the electronic compliance system (SEVIS) with electronic reporting to U.S. Homeland Security.
- 8. I agree to abide by Southeast's Student Code of Conduct and realize violation of the conditions of the Code may result in suspension or expulsion from the College which may cause me to be out of status with respect to my student visa.
