OVERVIEW

A well-rounded education with a range of courses in the arts, humanities, mathematics, and sciences lays the foundation for lifelong learning. By completing an Associate of Arts degree in Liberal Arts & Sciences (60 Credits) at Minnesota State College Southeast, you will earn a credential that enables you to transfer into a four-year university program as a college junior.

Studying liberal arts and sciences goes beyond memorizing facts; it teaches you how to learn, preparing you to adapt to an ever-changing world. Instead of training for a specific job, you gain communication and reasoning skills that enhance your career opportunities in any field you might pursue in the future. The Liberal Arts and Sciences AA degree is an excellent starting point if you are exploring your career options.

Students can complete an Associate of Arts degree in Liberal Arts & Sciences within four semesters at Southeast. The college offers all essential courses every semester, including evening, online, and hybrid classes. A full array of Liberal Arts and Sciences courses is available at both the Red Wing and Winona campuses.

This degree serves as a starting point for students unsure of their career paths, those aiming to transfer to a 4-year program not offered at Southeast, or those seeking a well-rounded 2-year general education degree.

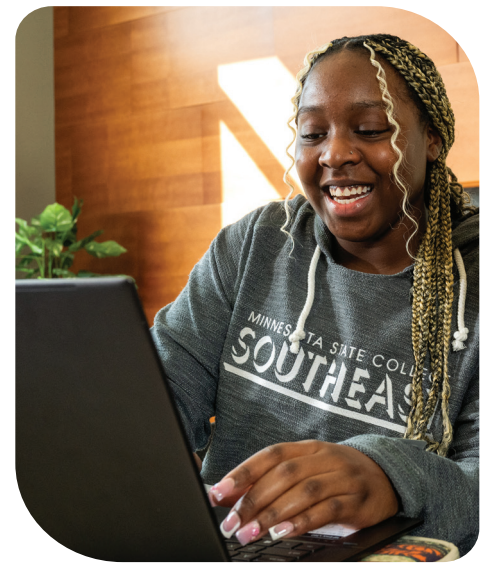
