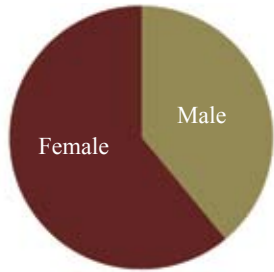

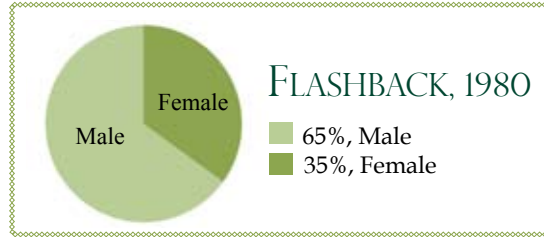

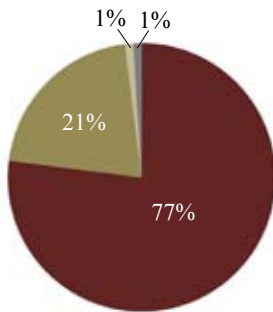
GENDER

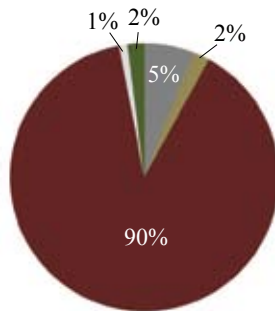
FLASHBACK, 1980

THROUGH YEARS OF CHANGE, MISSION STAYED THE SAME

The face of technical education has changed, but the overall mission remains the same. “Education for Employment” plain and simple. Technical education continues to embody a transformation that reaches out to the needs of our times staying true to our goal of being real, relevant and responsive. While our brick and mortar structures may appear relatively unchanged as they stand in the locations they were built on over three decades ago, passers by may assume it’s “business as usual” inside. However, once inside, evidence of change is apparent, not just visually with polished woodwork, gleaming glass and quiet hallways, but through the technology and services that are presented to the incoming and wondrous student.

Through the years, our name has changed, some remembering us as Red Wing Vocational Technical Institute or Winona Area Technical School and years later as Red Wing/Winona Technical College or for many simply “The Tech.” Technology remains embedded in both our name and mission, however the addition of transferable Liberal Arts and Sciences and Online courses and programs has moved the college forward into a new dimension.

1949

The second public vocational-technical school in the State of Minnesota is founded in Winona.

1966

The building at 1250 Homer Road is funded. Fall of 1967, the Homer Road facility is open to students.

1973

308 Pioneer Road in Red Wing opens its doors to students. In 1971, Red Wing became the final community in Minnesota to be awarded an Area Vocational Technical Institute.

1992

The merger of Red Wing Technical College and Winona Technical College is completed. The Aviation Training center is opened in Winona (Airport Campus).

A BRIEF PHOTO HISTORY

Among Winona’s first post secondary programs were Practical Nursing (1950) and Auto Mechanics (1959). Others followed in response to area airport. Circa 1980, statistics began to show an increase in the amount of female students and older students (21+) as going ‘back to school’ others, such as Farm Business Management and Aviation Mechanics have since been retired. The college continues to foster unique programs the Red Wing campus.

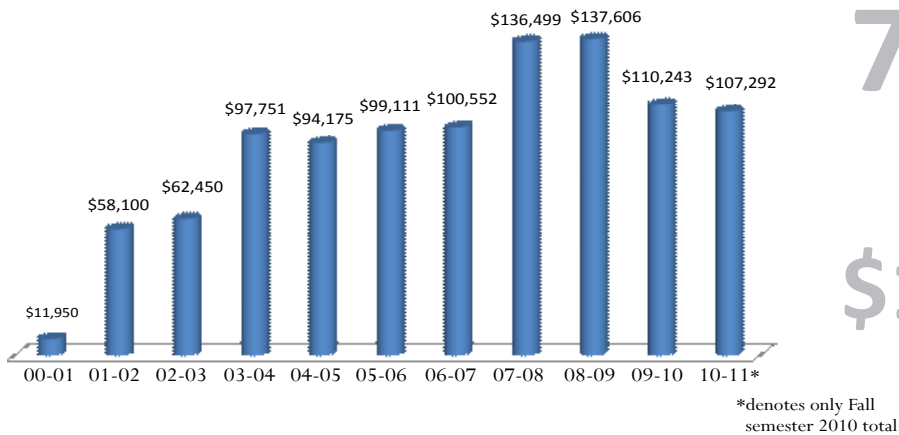


STATE FUNDS CONTINUE TO DECREASE NEED FOR SCHOLARSHIPS INCREASES IN 2011

The Southeast Technical Foundation's Scholarship Program is designed to increase access and affordability to our students as they pursue higher education at Southeast Technical College. Through the program, over the last ten years, more than \$1 million in scholarships have been awarded to more than 1,000 students, a great number that the Foundation is proud of.

However, unfortunately over the last decade, state appropriation per full year equivalent student has decreased 20% overall or about 2% per year. In 2000 appropriated state funds per student was \$4,811. Going into 2011 the estimated amount per student is \$3,831. As funding continues to decrease, Southeast Technical College will continue its quest to help our students make their pursuit for education less obtrusive financially. To do this, our need to furnish funding alternatives and philanthropic support will be even more important to the college and its students.

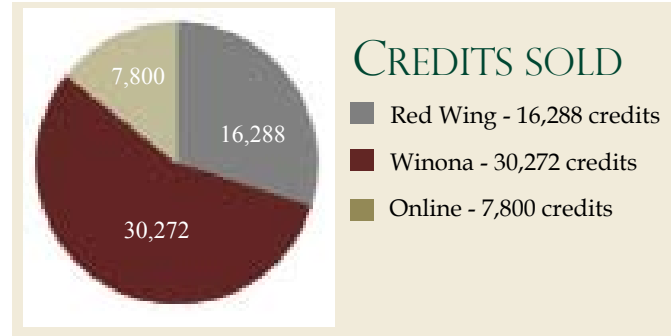

COLLEGE COMMUNITY GROWS - ENROLLMENT UP 3%

Minnesota State College-Southeast Technical announced another record increase in enrollment, reporting a 3% increase for the fall 2010 semester. Student head count is at 2,509 compared to 2,447 fall 2009. The college reports FYE (full year equivalent) student count is also up by 4% campus-wide.

According to Nate Emerson, Vice President of Student Affairs, "We are pleased to be able to offer additional courses for areas that are in demand, both in our program mix and by sustaining unprecedented growth in our Liberal Arts and Sciences and Online programming. Our strong faculty commitment to students and their ability to react to industry needs has been a winning formula here at Southeast Technical." Emerson adds, "The college is pleased to maintain a 93% placement rate; bottom line is our graduates are well-prepared to find employment upon graduation."



The college has positioned itself well to serve the needs of transfer students with recent changes that have allowed for the addition of more and more Liberal Arts and Science courses that are transferable to other colleges and universities throughout the region. The college has ramped up hiring to meet the increase by bringing in over 40 new instructors to meet this growth. The college has approximately 3,500 students over an academic year attending three campuses in Winona and Red Wing, translating into 2,000 full-time equivalencies (FYE's). "We're busy preparing future students now as we get ready for another year, as our next registration is in May," says Emerson. "As always we will do our best to open as many seats as possible to meet the demand, if needed."
