SCOPE: Remodel 38,000 GSF on the Winona campus

IMPACT:

- **Student Success:** Consolidates basic student services into single, visible, one stop location for enrollment and support
- Expand Capacity: Increases capacity for high-demand, high-wage academic programs
- Compliance: ADA and healthy air quality
- Student Safety: Transportation and K-12 student walkway
- Operational Savings: Increased efficiency and reduced energy consumption

PRIORITY 1: ONE STOP STUDENT SUCCESS CENTER

Create a student one stop by consolidating and streamlining access to critical services — admissions, registration, financial aid, advising, IT, bookstore, and mental health services.

PRIORITY 2: COSMETOLOGY

Redesign and relocate Cosmetology to meet increasing enrollment demands. Students are currently waitlisted to enter into this program.





PRIORITY 3: ALLIED HEALTH CENTER

Update spaces to increase capacity to address workforce needs in high-wage, high-demand fields. Renovate space and upgrade equipment to align to industry standards.

PRIORITY 4: STUDENT SAFETY/WALKWAY

Create a safe pedestrian connection from the main campus to the Transportation Center and Tandeski Center/Riverway Learning Community. Currently transportation program students and young children walk back and forth to the main campus through a busy parking lot.





PRIORITY 5: MECHANICAL/RESTROOMS/ENERGY

Replace air handling units to increase reliability, enhance air quality, and reduce maintenance and operations expenses.

Replace plumbing fixtures and install high efficiency LED technology.

PRIORITY 6: STUDENT LIFE/AUDITORIUM

Create a dedicated space for student engagement, collaboration, and individual and group studying. Expand space for basic needs/pantry and student life activities.
